It seems as though Social Roy frequently meets a field where there is a lot of other speed signed on, but he has shown time and again how game he is, even when he is not the lone pacesetter. A nine-time winner (six of them here at Gulfstream), Emisael Jaramillo will be back aboard this tough 6-year-old gelding.

**LONGSHOT: Race 3 - #7 Tenacity Zip**

A big 20-1 price on the morning line, this gelding by City Zip is getting ready to make his second start off the claim for trainer Yvon Belsoeur and taking a drop in class. After facing state bred stakes competition last time out, Tenacity Zip will now run against \$30,000 claimers, a level at which he was successful two starts back. He also has natural early speed, which he did not get to show against tougher last out.
