She has been very consistent with the exception of her last start, but throwing that race out, she was been in the money in her five previous starts, and against tougher company. She gets jockey Miguel Vasquez up today, who should suit her late running style very well.

**LONGSHOT: Race 8 - #5 Twenty and Four**

Given the competition that he is facing, this horse should be overlooked in the wagering, but definitely has a big chance in this spot. Getting a drop in class, Twenty and Four has won wiring the field as well as coming from off the pace, and has also won against tougher competition. I like the idea that he could sit a good trip here under jockey Luca Panici, and that he is 3-for-3 in the money at this distance, with two wins.
