Although this gelding will be a very short price, he looks tough to pick against. With lots of natural early speed, the blinkers were added last time out when he made his first start off the claim for trainer Victor Barboza Jr., and he won by more than seven lengths. That start was also after a freshening, and now he comes back in the next condition twenty days after that victory. Barboza is an astounding 40% with horses that won last time out and are making their second start off the claim.

**LONGSHOT: Race 5 - #6 Tenacity Zip**

Not only has this son of City Zip been running on the dirt lately, but he has been running against significantly tougher competition. He broke his maiden on synthetic up at Woodbine, and his lone turf start was a solid level against high allowance optional claiming company. Additionally, Tenacity Zip is the half-brother to multiple stakes winner Quality Lass, who was a three-time turf winner, and there is one other sibling who also won on the grass.
