BEST BET: Race 10: #4 Bronson

While Bronson does have a couple of question marks surrounding his form, and he will be facing stakes company today, he does have enough upside to make him my best bet. After following his first-out win effort with a fourth place finish in the Grade III Sanford, Bronson moved to the turf. He got a taste of added distance in his last two races, winning on a sloppy track and being beaten by two lengths on the synthetic in the GIII Spiral. Todd Pletcher has excellent synthetic to turf statistics in non-graded stakes, and still a positive return of investment out of a small sample size.

LONGSHOT: Race 8: #7 Dopo Lavoro

At 10-1 on the morning line, Dopo Lavoro is worth another look after his close second place finish last time out behind Dr. Corday, who is the half brother to the outstanding turf mare Lady Shipman. Making his third career turf start, this colt is a nicely built son of Harlan's Holiday.
