He has a versatile running style and show speed or sit just off the pace, and has a ton of back class, facing the likes of A. P. Indian in his last outing.

**LONGSHOT: Race 10 - #6 Gran Chama**

Victor Barboza Jr. has two runners in this race, and one of them, Lucky Bella, promises to take a lot of money off of her most recent victory. His other entry in Gran Chama will likely be a much better price, and has her own fair share of ability. A two-time winner at this mile distance and getting a big jockey change to Emisael Jaramillo, this one should improve today.
