BEST BET: Race 8 - #9 Chepstow

Having won five of his last seven starts, Chepstow is about as solid a horse as you can find. A 7-year-old gelding, he has a lot of early speed and gives his all each time. With an outside post and five wins at this distance, he should be very tough once again.

LONGSHOT: Race 10 - #11 Sir Sebastian

While he is the type of horse that usually gets a bit distracted and hard to handle in the afternoons, he has a lot of talent when his mind is set to business on the track. At a big price on the morning line, Sir Sebastian's recent form has been very solid, including a good win last time out. He has a nice closing kick (although he has also won by wiring the field in the past) and will probably fly under the radar.
