LONGSHOT: Race 8 - #4 Indys Empire

Indys Empire has never been a short price in her life, and that's good news for those bettors who do not trust any of the favorites in this wide open race. At 15-1 on the morning line, this filly has been freshened since April (a layoff that trainer Michelle Nihei does very well with on the turf). Additionally, she has been running against significantly tougher competition than the rest of the field, facing the likes of Notapradaprice in her last start, who is now stakes placed.
