**BEST BET: Race 5 - #8 Nothins Free**

As a three-year-old filly, Nothins Free fits the conditions of this race perfectly. She just notched her second career victory, and trainer Tammy Levy wins at a 20% clip with horses that won last out sprinting on the dirt, and finishes in the money 56% of the time. This filly is tactical and very consistent, and jockey Roberto Alvarado, Jr. fits her perfectly.

**LONGSHOT: Race 7 - #10 Majestic Secret**

At a big price on the morning line, I think this Kantharos colt could be a good value play. He is coming out of stakes competition, and, most importantly, is turning back in distance to 5 furlongs on the turf. Physically, this seems to be a good distance for him, and he crossed the wire first going 5 panels two starts back, even though he was disqualified and placed second. He's been working well, and also gets Emisael Jaramillo back in the saddle, who has had success on him before.
