LONGSHOT: Race 8 - #10 Delicious Pursuit

There are a few things to like with this Speightstown filly, one of which is definitely the price. She has the breeding, both on the top and the bottom, as the mare was a graded stakes winner and won on turf, and she should be able to handle the stretch out in distance. Her first race is a throw-out as she was compromised at the start, and she showed improved speed and got the maiden win last time out, in her first start for trainer Rodolfo Garcia.
