**LONGSHOT: Race 5 - #2 Warm Summer Wind**

Making her second career start for trainer Mickey Kroger (a barn that does very well at GPW), this filly is hoping to improve and promises to be a big price. Off very slowly and awkwardly out of the gate in her debut, she was totally compromised at the start of the race. It seems like the first race was educational and she should be better with a race under her belt.
