Turning back slightly to the mile distance, I do think Global Entry is perhaps a bit more potent going a little longer distance. However, he has run well at the mile before and, more than anything, I think he can sit a perfect trip today. I see quite a bit of speed signed on, and he should be able to close from off the pace. Picking up Irad Ortiz Jr. is also very noteworthy and I think he'll be the perfect fit at a great price.
