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**Training Hours: 5:15am until 9:45am. Two breaks from 6:45am to 7:30am and from 8:30am to 9:00am. Announcements alerting horsemen of upcoming breaks will be made by Security. Outriders will clear the track.**

**\*It is expressly understood that until such time as the stable area of Gulfstream Park West no longer remains under the control of Gulfstream Park Management, these rules will be applicable to all persons including trainers, their employees and/or representatives, owners, licensees operating or on the grounds of Gulfstream Park West and are fully enforceable by Gulfstream Park Management and/or the Gulfstream Park Stewards.**

## **SHIP IN PROCEDURES**

**Arrangements must be made prior to arrival with the Stall Office (954) 457-6300 and must arrive by 3:00pm.** Each horse seeking entrance into the Gulfstream Park and Palm Meadows Training Center stable areas shall:

- a). Be accompanied by a current negative Coggins test result.
- b). Be accompanied by and listed on an Official State Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which has been signed and dated within seventy two (72) hours of arrival by a licensed veterinarian, and shall contain the following written statement: **“The horses listed on this Official State Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) have not originated from, nor been stabled on, premises which has had Herpes Virus (EHV-1) diagnosed during the previous thirty (30) day period.”**
- c). Have proof of vaccination against Equine Herpes Virus Type 1 (EHV-1) by a licensed veterinarian within fourteen (14) days and a minimum of ninety (90) days prior to entry. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) shall also indicate the date of the vaccination and the vaccine product used to vaccinate each horse.

**Horses that arrive at the Stable Gate without prior approval from the Stall Office or the Racing Office and proper documentation will not be allowed to enter stable area. Only those horses arriving directly from Palm Meadows Training Center and shipping into the Receiving Barn to race, are excused from requiring a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for admission.**

**Ship-In and Ship-Out Hours** will be from **5:00am until 3:00pm daily**. Neither Vans nor trailers will be permitted into the stable area after 3:00pm nor before 5:00am. (Exceptions will be made in emergency situations). All shippers entered to run on live racing days need to be on the grounds on race day **NO later** than 10:30am for races 1 through 3 and 11:30am for races 4 through last.

### **RACE DAY SHIP INS**

All in-today horses receiving Furosemide (Salix) not stabled on the grounds, shipping from farms, training centers or outside racing facilities must be on the grounds at (4 ½) hours prior to their post time.

**Lorraine Shuttle will run one shuttle time at 7 a.m.**, unless deemed later by Lorraine agent. Lasix will be given at GP. All horses taking private shuttles must be at GP one hour prior to Lasix time or 11:00 am whichever is earlier for your race. Horses not requiring Furosemide (Salix) will be required to be on the grounds no later than 11:30 am. Horses shipping in to race on race days will be housed in the receiving barn.

### **COGGINS REQUIREMENTS**

All horses stabled on or entering Gulfstream Park properties must have on file with the Racing Office a current **Coggin's Test that is valid through the end of the current calendar year.** The form must include the horse's registered name, mark-ings, tattoo and /or microchip number. The form must be filled out completely reflecting all required information. If there is a name change a new valid Coggins form must be submitted. This also applies to any horse entered to race from any facility.

### **GULFSTREAM PARK VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS**

All racing animals must be vaccinated for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (the "Rhino Flu" vaccine) pursuant to Chapter 61D6.009(a)2 of the Florida Pari- Mutuel Wagering Rules. Entries will not be taken on those horses for which the trainer has not provided current vaccination information. All horses stabled on the grounds of Gulfstream Park and Palm Meadows Training Center must be vaccinated a minimum of twice yearly. **Trainers are responsible for maintaining at their barn, and submitting to the racing office, current vaccination records on all horses in their care.** Vaccination records of claimed horses must be transferred by the previous trainer to the claiming trainer within 24 hours of the official transfer of ownership.

### **SHIPPING OUT**

**ANY HORSE STABLED AT GULFSTREAM PARK OR PALM MEADOWS THAT SHIPS OUT (EXCLUDING RACE AND RETURNS BETWEEN SAME) WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO RUN FOR TEN (10) DAYS AFTER SHIPPING BACK IN.**

### **HORSE IDENTIFIER**

The Horse ID Office is open on race days from 8:00am until the last race. Horse ID may be contacted by calling (954)-457-6221 or by faxing (954)-457-6357.

## **DIGITAL TATTOO TRANSITION**

Effective January 1, 2020 Racehorse Identification transitioned from lip tattooing to Digital Tattooing (Picture Horse ID) and microchip implantation accessible through microchip scanning implanted in the horse's neck prior to its first race. All foals of 2018 and forward must be microchipped and The Jockey Club will register the horse. Microchips may be obtained through the Jockey Club by contacting them at (800) 444-8521.

## **FOAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES**

All foal registration certificates for horses entered to race must have a hard copy on file with the Gulfstream Park Horse Identifier or for foals of 2018 and after have GULFSTREAM PARK as the assigned Certificate Manager with the Jockey Club. ## **SECURITY – STABLE AREA RULES**

### **ADMITTANCE**

All stable identification passes are issued in the stable identification office and no one will receive such an identification badge unless he first obtains a state occupational license (See Licensing). For inquires please contact **Backside Security** at (954) 457-6982.

### **BADGES/BADGE LISTS**

Guards will pass only properly identified persons into the stable area. Immediately upon arrival, trainers or their authorized representatives must make out a list of all their employees, and update as necessary, in order that they may be issued a stable identification badge. The form for this list can be obtained at the Security office and must be signed by the trainer.

All trainers are responsible for the personnel named on their stable badge list. It is strictly prohibited for any trainer to include any person on their pass list who is not in their employ. All employees must be covered by their trainer's workman's compensation insurance. Violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action by the Stewards or by Management. **Any stable employee discharged by a trainer must be immediately reported to stable security and his or her badge must be confiscated.**

**No licensee shall permit anyone else to use his or her photo badge to gain entrance into the stable area and violators will be subject to disciplinary action.**

All licensed personnel entering and remaining in the stable area shall always wear in plain view the photo badge issued to them. Any violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.

### **TEMPORARY ADMITTANCE**

Any person desiring temporary admittance to the stable area must state his or her business to the Security office, who shall decide whether to issue a temporary pass. For inquiries please contact Backside Security at (954) 457-6982.

A Licensed owner, trainer, jockey or veterinarian may log in unlicensed guests with the Security Department and will be held responsible for their conduct and safety while on the grounds. Guests must remain with their sponsors while in the stable area.

**Gulfstream Park and/or any of its affiliates and/or properties, owned and/or managed by The Stronach Group and/or its employees is not responsible nor liable for the actions of, or injuries to, unauthorized invitees of Trainers.**

**\*At the present time only racing employees are allowed access to the barn areas. Guest passes are unavailable until further notice.**

### **STABLE RULES**

**All licensed personnel entering and remaining in the stable area shall always wear in plain view the photo badge issued to them. Any violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.**

All horses should have on halters while they are in their stalls. A lead shank is to be placed in the immediate vicinity of each horse in case of fire. No locks are permitted on any stall doors.

No washing or repairing of personal automobiles is allowed on the premises (subject to fine).

Trainers shall provide pistol grip nozzles for use on all water hoses. No water hose is to be used without such a nozzle. Please help our efforts to conserve water on the premises. Horses shall be washed at horse wash racks only.

Trainers will be responsible for the conduct of their employees and appearance, condition and safety of their living quarters and general working area.

Persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol will not be permitted to enter the stable area and anyone found in such a condition will be ejected for safety reasons and shall be otherwise subject to further disciplinary action.

Only veterinarians shall have on his or her person or among his or her personal effects, while on the premises, a hypodermic syringe or needle, or any medicines or drugs prohibited under the Division's or Gulfstream Park's medication rules.

All dogs on the backside must be on a leash.

No person shall use improper, profane or indecent language.

### **Mandatory Safety Helmets**

All exercise riders, jockeys, trainers, outriders, pony persons and others on horseback will be required to wear a safety helmet which meets the standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM 1163); UK Standard (EN-1384 and PAS015) or, Australian/New Zealand (AS/NZ 3838) while on or proceeding to and from the race track. Safety Helmet straps must always be fastened when on horseback.

### **Mandatory Safety Vests**

All exercise riders, jockeys, trainers, outriders, pony persons and others on horseback and assistant starters will be required to wear a safety vest designed to provide shock absorbing protection of at least a rating of 5, as defined by the British Equine Trade Association (BETA) while on or proceeding to and from the racetrack. Vests must always be zipped up when on horseback. Assistant Starters will be required to wear safety vests and helmets.

### **PONY PERSONNEL**

Pony personnel must have a valid state license, a copy of which shall be on file with the Association Stewards. All horses used by pony personnel in the morning and in the afternoon, must be registered and on file with the Association Stewards. Registration will consist of the horse's name, a photograph of the horse and a current Coggins certificate. All pony riders **MUST** conduct themselves in a manner appropriate to a family atmosphere. Prohibited acts included (but are not limited to) cursing, spitting, over disciplining ponies, striking ponies about the face or jerking on the bit, altercations with racing officials, other pony people, horsemen, or members of the public. Anyone in violation of these rules of conduct will not be allowed to work at Gulfstream Park for the remainder of the meet.

### **Pony Rules**

- 1) Tack must be clean and in good repair. Leather and rigging must be firmly attached by stitching and rivets. It cannot be loose or held together by tape, string, etc.
- 2) Helmets and vests must be fastened securely at all times. Vests must be secured by working Zipper or Velcro. Helmets must be secured by an approved chin strap. Safety Pins and Elastic bands may NOT be used to secure either helmets or vests!
- 3) **Gulfstream Park shirts and saddle towels MUST always be clean!**
- 4) Helmet covers must be black with no other color or design visible.
- 5) Shirts must be tucked into pants and cannot be cut off at the waist.
- 6) Undershirts, if visible, must be the same color as the Gulfstream Park polo shirt.
- 7) If the weather is cold and/or raining and you need to wear a sweatshirt or jacket, the Gulfstream Park jacket must be worn over the top, so it is visible.
- 8) Pants must be khaki or tan. Boots or riding shoes with heels must be worn.
- 9) Ponies stabled at Gulfstream Park as a stable pony may **ONLY** work for that trainer. No Exceptions! Anyone in violation of this rule will have his/her pony removed from grounds. Ponies may work only **ONE** shift per day. The only exception to this rule is as follows: A "stable pony" may work for his trainer in the morning and still be allowed to take his horses in the afternoon.



He will not be allowed to take horses for any other trainer in either session.

- 10) Ponies must meet all veterinarians' requirements and be properly documents to enter Gulfstream Park properties or work there.
- 11) Pony personnel are prohibited from using a cellular telephone when mounted on a horse.
- 12) Pony personnel must comply with management request to wear jackets or logo apparel in all sponsored races.
- 13) Ponies shall be washed and cleaned only at horse wash racks.

### **HANDLING AND DISPOSAL OF WASTE**

Designated bins are provided expressly for manure. Barrels are provided for trash, including but, not limited to bottles, cans and bandages. Failure to comply will constitute fine.

Hay and/or straw shall not be swept into drainage grates. These items shall be placed in the manure pits. Gulfstream Park limits and enforces straw bedding to 10% of the Trainer's stall allotment.

### **Dorm Rooms**

All sleeping and living quarters must be authorized and assigned by the Security Office before being occupied. No children are permitted to live in dorm rooms. Any person found occupying these quarters without the necessary permission is subject to a fine or suspension by the Stewards or ejection from the grounds. No unlicensed occupants are allowed.

Painting or pasting on the walls of dorm rooms is strictly forbidden. Removal of glass windows or screens from dormitory frames is prohibited. No Glass Bottles allowed in Rooms.

No Pets Allowed in Rooms unless authorized by management.

Anyone found cooking or tampering with fire detectors in the barn area will be expelled from the grounds and subject to further disciplinary action. The same rule applies to dormitory rooms. No loud music allowed. All music/stereos must be turned off by 9:00 pm. Departing Horsemen must leave dorm rooms and exterior hallway clean. Violators will receive a fine of up to \$50.00.

### **Tack and Feed Rooms**

Sleeping in feed rooms and stalls is strictly prohibited. Cooking in tack rooms or any other part of the stable area is prohibited. Cooking appliances found in the stable area and dorm rooms will be confiscated and disposed of and violators may be ejected and subject to further disciplinary action.

### **Fire and Safety Precautions**

Smoking is not allowed in dorm rooms, horse stalls, tack, and feed rooms or in the vicinity of the shed rows.

There shall be no tampering with smoke detectors. These items are for the safety of all on the property and shall not be touched unless done so by Gulfstream Park's staff. Any non-functioning or malfunctioning smoke detector shall be reported immediately to the

Security Office. Any tampering of such devices will result in immediate exclusion from the grounds.

In the event of a fire of any size, report same to the officer on duty at the main guardhouse or the Stable Superintendent.

All employees shall be instructed regarding the location of fire extinguishers and water supply in your barn. Any unsafe condition or fire hazard shall be reported at once to the Security Office or the guard on duty at the main guardhouse. Any electrical equipment trouble shall be reported immediately to the Security Office or the guard on duty at the main guardhouse.

All horses should have on halters while they are in their stalls. A lead shank is to be placed in the immediate vicinity of each horse in case of fire. No locks are permitted on any stall doors.

All stable area buildings are equipped with overhead sprinklers which are serviced regularly and certified on an annual basis. Sprinklers are programmed to automatically activate once a certain temperature is reached. Please note that the small plastic bags that cover each sprinkler are not to be removed.

Dormitories are equipped with pull station alarms (red) mounted on the passage wall closest to the exits.

Five-pound (5 lb.) ABC fire extinguishers are mounted on brackets at strategic locations throughout each barn and dormitory. Please be familiar with the location of the nearest fire extinguisher. In an emergency, please utilize the fire extinguishers in the following manner: Remove the fire extinguisher from the bracket; pull the pin on the handle; stand 5 to 15 feet from the fire; aim the nozzle at the base of the fire; then sweep back and forth. Extinguishers will only last 10 to 12 seconds. If the fire is not extinguished after the discharge is complete, leave the area while closing the door behind you (if inside). Sprinklers should be activated at this time. After extinguisher is discharged, contact the Stable Manager in order to have a replacement issued.

While on the premises, no licensee shall have on his or her person or among their personal effects an electrical or mechanical device which may affect the normal performance of a horse.

No licensee shall carry or exhibit a deadly weapon or otherwise disturb the peace on the premises.

No person shall have in his possession any narcotic or hallucinogenic drug, marijuana, or any other drug listed under the dangerous drug laws of Florida unless said drug has been prescribed by a physician or veterinarian.

### **Parking**

Parking at Gulfstream Park and Gulfstream Park is only allowed for Horsemen and not stable employees and is permitted in designated

areas only. Employees of Trainers stabled at Palm Meadows are allowed to park in the stable area. It is strictly forbidden to park cars between the barns, in front of manure pits and on or near horse paths.

No motorcycles and /or mopeds allowed in the barn area.

Backside Security office provides hang down's to authorized personnel when the requestor provides the proper documentation. Proper documentation is described as; a valid Florida pari-mutuel license, proof of occupation, (must be on a trainer's badge list), valid US driver's license, vehicle registration and vehicle insurance.

Horsemen may obtain various parking permits from the backside security office located after the stable gate at dorm B next to the cantina. The hang down or pass is only valid for the current racing season. You must get a new hang down every racing season. The hang downs are issued based on the type of Florida Mutuel License code. There are three (3) types of parking hang downs which may be issued: H Hang down (horsemen) - allowed to enter the stable area at any time. This also includes horsemen's parking. These are issued to horse trainer, assistant trainers and owners.

S Hang down (stable) - must park in kitchen parking lot. Allowed to drive in after training hours by permission only to pick up laundry, etc. Parking is limited to foremen, clockers, grooms, exercise riders and night watchmen. Vehicles with a stable hanger parked in the barn area without permission from Security are subject to disciplinary actions including boot, or tow, fines and loss of the privilege to park in the backside.

V Hang down (vendors) - allowed to enter the stable area. Vendors include, but are not limited to: Veterinarians, Dentists, Jockey Agents, Blacksmiths, Bloodstock Agents, Feed Companies, Tack Companies, and Van Companies and their agents.

The Hang down must be clearly visible in the front window. Parking of Stable Personnel is only permitted in designated areas. Hang downs are non-transferrable between horsemen. Anyone who loans his hang down to another person is subject to disciplinary action, includes, fines, loss of the privilege to park in the backside and or trespass from the property.

No parking permitted along the horse paths at any time of the day or night. All efforts should be made to avoid creating any disturbance of noise in these areas. There shall be no parking along the fence in the grass areas from Barn 4 to Barn 14 at any time. Following the conclusion of training hours parking is not permitted in the proximity of the front gate.

## LICENSING

The rules of the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering require that all racing personnel, including owners and trainers, must be licensed prior to active participation in racing and that their fingerprints be on file with Division. **Only checks or money orders will be accepted as payment for occupational licenses and fines.** All participants are presumed to know the rules of the Division and the Association.

**Trainers or their authorized representative must register with Track Security every person in his/her employ and shall be responsible for all his/her employees securing occupational licenses immediately after submission of this registration. Trainers having unlicensed personnel in their employ after this period, are subject to disciplinary actions and expulsion.**

Each person applying to be licensed by the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering must be at least sixteen (16) years of age. A person under eighteen (18) years of age who desires to work in the barn area must first secure the necessary work permit from his or her school authorities. This permit should accompany a letter from that minor's parents or guardian approving his employment. No stable may have in his employ any minor under sixteen (16) years of age except as may be permitted by the applicable laws of the State of Florida.

## TRAINERS' RULES

Proof of Workers' Compensation Insurance must be on file with the racing department for ALL trainers stabled and/or racing at Gulfstream Park. Permission granted to enter onto the premises and to use GULFSTREAM PARK'S and/or Palm Meadows' Training Center's facilities is subject to revocation with or without cause and in the sole and exclusive discretion of GULFSTREAM PARK Management upon 24 hours' notice and Licensee shall bear all costs of vacating the premises. Trainers shall maintain Workers' Compensation insurance while stabled, training, racing or on the premise of any property owned, operated or managed by The Stronach Group and/or its representatives. Anyone working in any capacity for any trainer, owner or licensee, including but not limited to exercise riders, hot walkers and grooms, must be an employee of trainer, owner or licensee and shall be covered at all times by Workers' Compensation insurance.

**Trainers or their authorized representative must register with Track Security every person in his/her employ (and shall update, as necessary) and shall be responsible for all his/her employees securing occupational licenses immediately after submission of this registration. Trainers having unlicensed personnel in their employ after this period, are subject to disciplinary actions and expulsion.**

**Gulfstream Park is not responsible or liable for the actions of, or injuries to, unauthorized invitees of Trainers.**

**Trainers shall not cause or create any hazard or risk that may injure or damage any person, animal or property, and shall take all reasonable and necessary precautions to prevent or remove such hazards or risks. Trainers shall maintain and provide proof of liability insurance coverage to cover Trainer's presence and actions on Gulfstream Park premises and/or any Stronach owned or managed property.**

**In regard to coronavirus/Covid 19, Trainers shall comply with all health and safety laws, regulations, rules and guidance, and shall comply with all rules and requirements of Gulfstream Park, including any pre-entry screening and testing requirements.**

## **ENTERING HORSES**

### **ELIGIBILITY AND WEIGHT ALLOWANCES**

**Under the rules of racing, trainers are urged to carefully check the eligibility and weight allowances of all horses entered in races. The racing office will assist in any way possible for all horses entered; however, the final responsibility rests with the trainer.**

Horses not entitled to the first weight allowance in a race, shall not be entitled to the second and so on.

Hunt meet races are not considered in eligibility or weight allowances.

### **CONDITION ELIGIBILITY**

Condition Eligibility, horses that have started for less than \$25,000 in their last 5 starts are least preferred unless they have finished 1st, 2nd, or 3rd for \$25,000 or more since then. Gulfstream Park holds the right to waive supplemental fees to all stakes at any time.

Starter Stakes will be considered allowance races for eligibility.

### **AGE ELIGIBILITY**

**YEARLINGS are not permitted.**

**ELEVEN YEAR OLDS AND OLDER are not permitted.**

**MAIDENS:** No six-year olds or older which have not started. No six-year olds or older that have not finished 2nd, 3rd or 4th in last four starts. No six year olds and upward that have not started within three months of race date.

**WINNERS:** Ten-year olds must be approved by the track veterinarian prior to start.

### **PREGNANCY**

A pregnant filly or mare may not be entered in a race if she is beyond 120 days of gestation. If a pregnant filly or mare is entered in a claiming race, she must be less than 120 days of gestation and her owner must provide, at time of entry to the Racing Secretary, a valid stallion service certificate.

**TWO YEAR OLDS** Two Year Olds must reach their chronological date of birth by race date. **LASIX NOT PERMITTED WITHIN 24 HOURS OF POST TIME FOR TWO YEAR OLDS.**

**FOUR YEAR OLDS AND UP:** Any horse 4yo and up that has started at \$10,000 maiden or \$6,250 claiming on the dirt or \$12,500 maiden or \$10,000 claiming level on the turf and has not finished first through fourth in their last (4) starts as per surface will not be eligible to enter. Starter Stakes will be considered allowance races for eligibility.

**OVERSUBSCRIBED STAKES RACES:** Preference will be given to Graded Stakes winners within 24 months of race date, Graded Stakes placed within 24 months of race date, Non-restricted Stakes winners within 24 months of race date, highest total earnings.

### **UNCOUPLED ENTRIES**

All entries, either same owner or different owner, shall be uncoupled wagering interests in any race. Same owner entries will have least preference in overfilled races except for condition eligibility. The date system will take preference in determining first and second parts of entries. The exception to the rule will be when a trainer designates a "Turf Only" and an "MTO" in the same race.

### **CROSS ENTERING**

A horse shall not be entered in two races on the same day **NO EXCEPTIONS...** this includes **ALL STAKES.** A trainer can enter two horses per surface per race excluding Stake Races, Handicaps and Split races. The entries of any person, or the transfer of any horse, may be refused without notice for reasons deemed by Gulfstream Park Management to be in the best interests of racing.

### **FIRST TIME STARTERS**

Horses which are First Time Starters shall not be allowed to start unless the Jockey Club Registration Certificate is on file and has been officially microchipped or tattooed.

The Starter must approve entries of first-time starters. Written approval must be on file in the Racing Office at time of entry. Imported horses must be approved by the Starter before starting. Foal papers must be on file in the Horse I.D. office by time of entry.

### **EQUIPMENT RULES**

Permission for any change of equipment which was used in the previous race must be obtained from the Paddock Judge. A change of blinkers must be approved by the Starter and reported to the Racing Office at time of entry and be included in the racing program. Any other late change is at the discretion of the Stewards.

Any use of the Cornell Collar must be reported to the Paddock Judge at time of entry. Any use of Cheek Pieces must be declared at time of entry. Approval by the Stewards and Paddock Judge must be obtained prior to starting.

### **PADDOCK ARRIVAL**

Trainers are responsible for horses arriving in the paddock k at the proper time. Should a horse arrive late, resulting in a delay of the post parade or scratching the horse, the trainer or his assistant is subject to a fine.

### **OWNER/TRAINER TRANSFERS**

Any trainer changes of a horse must be reported to and on file with the Stewards Office. Owner changes will be processed via proper bills of sale and must be submitted **prior to entry**. Horses sold or transferred at Gulfstream Park will not constitute an entitlement for stabling.

**Alterations** in the sex of a horse must be reported by the owner or trainer to the racing office and horse identifier in writing **prior to entry**.

### **PROHIBITED ENTRIES**

Trainer shall not enter or start a horse that is:

- a. Not in sound racing condition,
- b. On the Starter, Stewards, or Veterinarian's List, unless approved by the Stewards or Racing Secretary and off the Veterinarian's List by race day.
- c. Barred from racing in another State or jurisdiction,
- d. Has impaired eyesight in both eyes,
- e. Entries will not be taken on those horses for which the trainer has not provided current vaccination information.
- f. A horse that has been nerved under the fetlock may not be permitted to start without permission by the Association Veterinarian.

**No alterations may be made of an entry or race after closing, except to correct an error.**

### **TURF RACE ENTRIES**

Any trainer entering in a turf race must declare the horse as turf only, either way (69) or main track only (MTO). If the race is switched to the main course, any horse which the trainer scratches will receive a scratch date for that day and if the horse was entered either way it will not be eligible to run for 10 days. Any trainer having an “entry” in a turf race, one being a turf horse and the other designated as “MTO” only, will retain his date on the turf horse if the race is taken off of the turf and the turf horse scratches and if the “MTO” part of entry runs. This rule is necessary to ensure perdurability of Gulfstream Park purse accounts and gives the racing fans an opportunity to wager on a reasonable number of horses. There shall be no exceptions to this rule. Any MTO re-entered in dirt races will run at the discretion of the Stewards.

### **UNCOUPLED ENTRIES**

All entries, either same owner or different owner, shall be uncoupled wagering interests in any race. Same owner entries will have least preference in overfilled races. The date system will take preference in determining first and second parts of entries. The exception to the rule will be when a trainer designates a “Turf Only” and a “MTO” in the same race.

### **PREFERENCE DATE SYSTEM**

**The Preference Date System will be used at the Gulfstream Park Spring/Summer Meet beginning April 1, 2021 as described below:**

Each day’s overnight will list the dates of horses in including also eligibles to enable trainers to see which dates are getting horses into over-filled races.

1. All horses intended for racing at The Gulfstream Park Spring/Summer Meet beginning April 1, 2021 will be assigned a preference date. A horse can have only one date at any time. Dates assigned will be of four types: Zero (0) date; Entry (E) date; Race (R) date; Scratch(S) date.
2. All horses and trainers stabled at Gulfstream Park, GPW, Palm Meadows, Payson Park and Palm Beach Downs will have a zero date for all categories. If you run out of town, that date becomes your new date.
3. A horse receives an (E) date corresponding to the date in which he/she was excluded from a race or was on the also-eligible list on the overnight.
4. A horse receives an (R) date corresponding to the date of a horse’s most recent race at Gulfstream Park.
5. A horse receives an (S) date both turf and dirt, corresponding to the date on which a horse was entered to run, included in the main body of a race on the overnight and was scratched.
6. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot. In cases where dates are the same, the preference will be in order of 0, E, R, S

dates and with preference given to horses



- running either way in turf races.
7. A horse keeps his (0) date until he/she runs, scratches or the Jockey Club Registration Certificate is removed from the racing office. Preference dates are good at any distance or surface. Once a horse has started, he/she will receive a preference date corresponding to the date he/she races and then lose all dates previously held except for stakes races.
  8. Horses on the also-eligible list shall be permitted to Draw into a race in the order of their dates, earliest dates first. Any horse that scratches from a turf race that is moved to the main track **LOSES** all prior dates unless they run on the dirt in which case, they will receive a "special" date.
  9. Horses given special off-turf dates from the previous meet will be given a Zero (0) date and will retain first preference in overfilled turf races.
  - 10.** Once a final has been announced, additional entries in overfilled races will have least preference.
  11. The draw of a stake or overnight stake is not subject to date preference.
  12. Preference dates are transferred through change in ownership or trainer, only after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Steward's Office.
  13. Trainers are responsible for verifying dates before scratch time.
  14. Horses placed on the Stewards, Veterinarians or Starter's lists will not be permitted to enter until they are off the list unless approved by The Stewards or Racing Secretary and off the list by race day.

### **SHOE RULE**

Toe grabs with a height greater than two (2) millimeters, bends, jar caulks, stickers and any other traction device worn on front shoes are prohibited on all racing surfaces. Any hind shoe with a bend of more than one-quarter (1/4") inch will not be allowed.

For the turf course, no shoes with caulks, raised toes, mud nails or bent shoes will be permitted. Only Flat, Queens Plate, Queens Plate XT, Silver Queens and Factory Wedge are allowed.

**NAMING OF JOCKEYS** (a) Each horse to be drawn into the body of a race or as an also eligible shall have a jockey named by the time established by the Racing Secretary for the drawing of post positions and prior to the publication of the overnight. A Jockey may not be named to ride more than one horse in a race except that jockey may be named to ride a horse drawn into the body of a race and a horse drawn as an also eligible in such race and only if a backup-rider is indicated for the horse with second call or in special circumstances with permission granted in advance by the Stewards. (b) An apprentice allowance may only be claimed before entries have closed and or

drawn and only if the apprentice has been engaged. (c) It shall be the

responsibility of the trainer to ensure compliance with this rule. Upon request, the Racing Secretary's office at the time when entries are taken shall notify the trainer of the availability of specific jockeys. Should a jockey remain unnamed at the time prescribed herein, then the Stewards, or their designee shall name the jockey. Once named, a jockey shall not be changed except for good cause as determined by the Stewards. (d) It shall be the responsibility of both jockey and trainer to fulfill their engagements. A double jockey mount fee will be charged that is equivalent to what the jockey has earned on said horse.  
**\*Purse Distributions and Jockey Mount Fees See Bookkeeping.**

## **OWNER'S SILKS**

All owners must have registered silks available for their horses. Substitute silks may be used only twice before fines are imposed. All silks must be retrieved from the Jockeys Room no later than closing day. The Jockey's Room is located north of the paddock.

## **WORKOUT RULES AND DISTANCE CHANGES**

1. Trainers desiring to work a horse in between races must obtain permission from Management. Permission for any workouts after the finish of a race must be obtained from the Stewards.
2. Horses nominated to a Turf Stake will be permitted to work one (1) time prior to that Stake Race. Horses whose last race was in a Claiming Race or who are Maidens will not be permitted to work on the Turf course even if they are nominated to a stakes race.
3. Turf workouts will be limited to Sundays only from 9:30am-10:00am weather permitting. Permission must be granted by the Racing Secretary and a signed workout slip must be obtained prior to working.
4. Any in-today horse scratched by a veterinarian that shows up on the work tab within 48 hours of the race day scratch, the veterinarian and the trainer will be subject to fines and/or suspensions.
5. No backtracking in front of the starting gate from 7:30am until 8:30am on the days when the starting gate is open.

**In the event a race must be transferred from the Turf to the Main Course, the following distances will be used:**

### WORKOUT REQUIREMENTS

All trainers must report morning workouts for horses breezing to the official clockers. Upon the request of the official clockers trainers shall correctly identify the horse he/she is working and state the distance and point on the racetrack where the workout is intended to start. The official clockers must make sure all workouts are published with accurate times. Horses that haven't run in the past (45) days must have a published workout within (30) days; **First time starters** must have a gate card and a minimum of 2 published workouts within (45) days prior to starting. **Horses that have not started in one year must have two (2) published works within 45 days.**

Horses may not race or work for a minimum of ten (10) days after receiving a Shock Wave Therapy treatment. Day "one" will be considered the first day following the date of the treatment. (Example: if you receive a Shock Wave Therapy treatment on January 1, you will be eligible to run on January 12).

\*See Shock Wave policy/veterinarians.

### JOCKEY RULES

#### RIDING CROPS

In any race in which a jockey will ride without a riding crop, an announcement of that fact shall be made over public address system. The riding crop shall only be used for safety, correction and encouragement, and be appropriate, proportionate and professional, taking into account the rules of racing herein. Stimulus provided by the use of the riding crop shall be monitored so as not to compromise the welfare of the horse.

Rules regarding riding crop type as follows:

- All riding crops are subject to inspection and approval by the Stewards and Clerk of Scales.
- Only riding crops meeting specifications set below, including the mandatory shock absorbing characteristics, shall be allowed in thoroughbred racing including training.
- Approved riding crops shall have a maximum weight of eight (8) oz., diameter of the shaft of one-half (1/2) inch.

- The only additional feature that may be attached to the riding crop is a flap, which shall fall within specifications below:
  - \* A maximum length of flap from the end of the shaft of one-half (1/2) inch.
  - \* A maximum width of the flap one and six-tenths (1.6) inches, with a minimum width of eight tenths (0.8) inch;
  - \* The flap from the end of the shaft must contain any reinforcements of additions:
    - \* There shall be no binding with seven (7) inches of the end of the flap;
    - \* The contact area of the shaft must be smooth, with no protrusion or raised surface, and covered by shock absorbing material throughout its circumference;
    - \* The flap must have similar shock absorbing characteristics to that of the contact area.
- No stingers or projections extending through the hole of a popper or any metal part on a riding crop shall be permitted.

### **APPRENTICE JOCKEYS - WEIGHT ALLOWANCES**

1. 10 lbs. until he/she has ridden 5 winners.
2. 7 lbs. until he/she rides an additional 35 winners.
3. 5 lbs. after his/her 40th winner, for one year from date of their 5th winner, plus any extension periods.
4. Apprentice allowances will be authorized provided the Stewards are able to verify, with reasonable certainty, the prior riding record of any jockey for applying for the apprentice allowance. If the Stewards are not able to verify same with reasonable certainty, that jockey will not be authorized to take the apprentice allowance pending further action of the Stewards.

### **JOCKEY'S ADVERTISING**

Jockeys may wear advertising on ball caps, jockey breeches and neckwear only. All advertising must be approved by the owner and trainer and must not alter the colors or the configuration of those registered to the owner. All advertising is subject to written approval of Gulfstream Park Racing Association, Inc. Approval forms will be available in the Executive Office, Racing Office and Jockey's Room. Full language about advertising is available for viewing in Gulfstream Park's House Rules.

### **PRERACE RULES**

All horses shall be given a pre-race examination on the day of the race. The pre-race examination shall be made by Association Veterinarians to determine fitness to race. In-today horses are not to be placed in ice until after prerace examinations by the Association Veterinarians. All Bandages must be removed for prerace

examinations. Horses excused for medical reasons by the Association Veterinarian shall be placed on the Veterinarian's List.

## LASIX RULES

**Florida Statute 550.2415 Sec (8) Furosemide is the only medication that may be administered within 24 hours before the officially scheduled post time of a race, but it may not be administered within 4 hours before the officially scheduled post time of a race.**

Gulfstream Park utilizes 3<sup>rd</sup> party administration of Lasix. Gulfstream Park regulatory veterinarians will treat every horse eligible to run at Gulfstream Park. It is imperative to know the following information about this new program.

1. 6:00am Race Day you will hang a red In Today sign on your horse's stall. This will make it easier to identify your horse for the pre-race exam and the administration of Lasix.
2. Every horse that is on Lasix will be treated 4 to 4½ hours before its published post time.
3. Dosage for Lasix will be 5cc unless otherwise specified by the attendant.
4. **IT IS NOT AN OPTION FOR THE HORSE TO BE TREATED WITHOUT AN ATTENDANT. AN ATTENDANT MUST BE PRESENT FOR TREATMENT OF LASIX.**
5. If a horse is scratched due to no attendant at the barn, a fine will be issued at the discretion of the Stewards. Fines will increase with each offense.
6. All horses not stabled at Gulfstream Park must be on the grounds 5 hours prior to post time or no later than 11:30a.m. For horses stabled at Palm Meadows, the Lorraine Shuttle leaves for Races 1-5 at 7:00am and for Races 6-10 at 9:00am. Lasix will be given at GP. All horses taking private shuttle must be at GP one hour prior to Lasix time for your race or 11:30am whichever is earlier.
7. All costs will be deducted from Horsemen's Bookkeeper Owner's account so no billing by the trainer is required.
8. **NO PRIVATE VETS IN THE STALL ON RACE DAY.**
9. **NO OTHER MEDICATIONS CAN BE GIVEN ON RACEDAY.**
10. There will be a Lasix Vet present at Gulfstream Park.
11. If you are stabled at Gulfstream Park prerace exams will be done on the premises. All other prerace exams for shippers including Palm Meadows will be done at the Gulfstream Park.
12. As a condition of entry, the owner and/or trainer of a horse agrees to allow and provides consent for, the Gulfstream Park Salix Coordinator to release the most recent dose of Furosemide (Salix) that the horse received prior to transfer to the new owner/trainer.
13. The State of Florida suspends bleeders (within a 365 day period) in the following manner: 1<sup>st</sup> incident ten (10) days;

2<sup>nd</sup> incident thirty (30) days; 3<sup>rd</sup> incident one hundred and eighty (180) days and 4<sup>th</sup> incident – barred from racing.

## **SCRATCH RULES**

**NO PRIVATE VETS IN THE STALL ON RACE DAY, IF YOUR HORSE IS SICK AND NEEDS TO BE SCRATCHED PLEASE CONTACT THE STEWARDS, SECURITY OR TRACK VETERINARIAN.**

1. If a horse is scratched due to no attendant at the barn, a fine will be issued at the discretion of the Stewards. Fines will increase with each offense.
2. Veterinary Scratches will not be accepted unless your Veterinarian is consulted and prescribes or administers treatment. Veterinary cards must be submitted to the Stewards.
3. Scratches will be made off the program and are irrevocable.
4. A horse that has been scratched or excused from starting by the stewards because of physical disability or sickness for which a private vet has submitted a scratch card, shall be placed on the Association Stewards ineligible to race list for ten (10) calendar days beginning the race day from which the horse was scratched.
5. All race day scratches need to be submitted to the Stewards no later than 10:00am on race day.
6. If a horse is scratched due to a change in ownership, or if a horse is scratched due to any owner/trainer conflict, the owner and/or trainer may be subject to a fine at the discretion of the Stewards.
7. Any in-today horse that needs to be scratched, on the advice of a veterinarian for any issue, is not a trainer scratch, and shows up on the work tab within 48 hours of the race day scratch, the respective veterinarian and trainer will be subject to fines and/or suspensions.
8. All Veterinarian records for the scratched horses must be produced to the Stewards.

## **HORSEMEN'S BOOKKEEPER**

**FOR A COMPLETE GUIDE TO BOOKKEEPERS' RULES AND REGULATIONS PLEASE SEE THE FHBPA OFFICE.**

**The Horsemen's Bookkeeper's Office is in the Racing Office and is open on Wednesdays at 10:00am and every other racing day from 9:30am until the last race of the day is official. Phone number is 954-457-6222; email [gphbc@gulfstreampark.com](mailto:gphbc@gulfstreampark.com); Fax #954-457-6592.**

Horsemen's accounts require a W-9 on file with the Bookkeepers' Office. In the absence of a W-9, a thirty (30%) percent Federal tax withholding will

be deducted from gross earnings and a fifty (\$50) dollar per year penalty will be applied.

Any fees assigned for a Stake Race must be paid in advance of the race.

If a horse runs in the name of a partnership, any checks issued will be issued in the name of the Authorized Owner only. The horsemen's bookkeeper will not pay out percentages to partners.

Horsemen's accounts must be kept current and in good standing.

**Check Requests** – Must be in writing - requests by 12:00pm will be available by 4:00pm the same day. After 12:00pm available the following racing day.

**Direct Deposits**-Will be available soon. Please contact the Horsemen's Bookkeeper if you want to opt-in to this feature.

**Deposits** – All checks for deposit into horsemen's accounts must be made payable to Gulfstream Park Horsemen's Bookkeeper Corporation - no exceptions. No cash deposits will be accepted - checks or wire transfers only. Personal checks will be held for seven (7) to ten (10) business days. Cashier's checks will be held for forty-eight (48) hours after deposit. Wire transfers available upon receipt.

**Deposits via Wire Transfer** - Owners may deposit funds via wire transfer from their bank, only to their Gulfstream Park Bookkeeper's Account. No exceptions. Should there be any question, please contact the bookkeeper's office prior to wiring funds, as non-compliant wires will be rejected and will incur a \$55.00 fee. In addition, returned wires may take up to seven days to process.

**Claiming** – enough funds (including applicable taxes) must be legally available in the Bookkeepers' Office sixty (60) minutes before post time of the targeted race. Sales tax for Dade and Broward Counties is seven (7%) percent.

## CLAIMING

Any horse claimed must race for the same claiming price or higher for a period of 30 days. The horse is eligible to race for less on the 31st day. In order to be eligible to claim at Gulfstream Park a trainer **MUST HAVE STALLS at Gulfstream Park, Gulfstream Park West or Palm Meadows.** Any owner will be eligible to claim if they have a valid current Florida Pari-Mutuel license and an account set-up with



the Horsemen's Bookkeeper with enough funds to cover the claim and any potential taxes affiliated with same. If you are a shipper and lose your horse, you can replace that horse (one for one claim) during the current meet. **ANY HORSE CLAIMED AT THE GULFSTREAM PARK WINTER MEET STARTING December 2, 2020 WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO RUN AT ANY OTHER RACETRACK FOR 90 DAYS.** Only exception will be for one stake race which needs to be approved by the Stewards. If a horse is claimed, it shall not be sold or transferred to another Owner or trainer wholly or in part, except in a claiming race, for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of claim, nor shall it, unless reclaimed, remain in the same stable or under the control of management of its former owner or trainer for the same period, unless mitigating circumstances require Stewards' discretionary action. Any horse that hasn't started in 180 or more calendar days since its last start, will have the opportunity not to be claimed, if it is declared at time of entry and if it is entered for equal or greater value of its last start. (Starter races excluded). This will only be allowed for the first start back from the 180-day layoff.

Notwithstanding any designation of sex in the racing program or in any official Racing Publication, the claimant of a horse shall be solely responsible for determining the sex of the animal claimed.

Vaccination records of claimed horses must be transferred by the previous trainer to the claiming trainer within 24 hours of the official transfer of ownership.

**All Co-Ownership Accounts must have an Authorized Owner Form or Authorized Agent Form on file with the Horsemen's Bookkeepers' Office PRIOR to submitting a claim.**

**Dade and Broward County Sales Tax is 7% for claiming.**

**\*\*\*CLAIM TIME ENDS TWELVE MINUTES BEFORE EACH RACE\*\*\***

**A trainer may claim a maximum of (2) two horses per race, provided the claims are for two different owners and two different horses. No trainer is permitted to submit a claim for a horse that is owned by a current owner in his/her stable. No Owner, Trainer, Assistant Trainer or Authorized Agent shall be permitted in the saddling area, paddock or walking ring during a claiming race unless he or she has a horse in that race. Violators will be subject to a fine and/or suspension and any claims submitted by them from that race will be voided.**

Concerning a claimed horse; the trainer of record of the horse that was claimed shall have his veterinarian supply the Equine Health & Safety Director within 72 hours a report in writing or (email) the joint(s) injection(s) performed on said animal within the last 30 days. Report will include joint(s) involved, medication used (Depo-Medrol, Hyaluronic acid, etc.) and the dose used. This data will be shared with the party who claimed



could be used for injection to any person within the grounds where race horses are stabled. Only one-time disposable syringes and infusion tubes are authorized for use in the treatment of racehorses on the grounds. Only veterinarians shall have on his or her person or among his or her personal effects, while on the premises, a hypodermic syringe or needle, or any medicines or drugs prohibited under the Division's or Gulfstream Park's medication rules.

An owner or trainer shall not employ any veterinarian who has not been licensed with the State of Florida. Licensed veterinarians shall list all employees with track security.

The Association Veterinarian shall maintain a "Veterinarian's List" which includes any horse which is considered unfit, unsound or unserviceable for racing. A horse on the Veterinarian's List shall be refused entry until the Association veterinarian removes it from the list.

Veterinarians shall keep a daily log of horses treated by the trainer, the date and time and amount and type of medication. This log shall be available at all times for inspection by the Division and Association Veterinarian.

### **EQUINE FATALITIES**

Upon the death of a horse on the grounds of Gulfstream Park or Palm Meadows the association veterinarian, at their discretion through their agents, may take control of the bodily remains of the deceased horse; and/or order an appropriate necropsy to be conducted by a qualified veterinarian. Should the death of a horse occur during the running of a race, control of the horse will remain with the association veterinarian until released. Any owner or trainer who wants a necropsy performed on their horse must immediately notify Security and make their own arrangements for same.

Consent is also given to the track veterinarian to release injury date, when required or deemed appropriate. It is the responsibility of the trainer and the attending licensed veterinarian to inform the stable area security office that a horse is deceased and to provide the required details and information.

Upon the death of a horse on the grounds of Gulfstream Park, the remains of the deceased horse shall not be removed without a death certificate by a licensed veterinarian filed with the Security.

### **PROHIBITED PRACTICES**

Experimental drugs awaiting Federal Drug Administration approval, and drugs not authorized for use in the United States, shall not be used or possessed on the grounds of the Association. The possession of blood- doping agents with no known or legitimate therapeutic value

including, but not limited to Hemopure, Oxyglobin, Epogen, Procrit and Araneso and similar agents is strictly prohibited. This list of prohibited drugs will be updated as necessary.

### **CLENBUTEROL**

1. Clenbuterol use is prohibited in racing and training unless the following conditions have been met
  - a. The prescription for clenbuterol is made for a specific horse based upon a specific diagnosis. The prescription and volume dispensed cannot exceed a treatment period of 30 days.
  - b. The veterinarian must provide a copy of the prescription and diagnosis to the Gulfstream Park Senior Veterinarian for review and approval. The horse may not receive clenbuterol before this approval is issued.
  - c. Trainers must make daily notification to the racing office of horse(s) in their custody having been administered clenbuterol. Notification shall be made on a form and by a deadline designated by Gulfstream Park.
  - d. A horse to which clenbuterol has been administered shall be placed on the official Veterinarian's List and must include a timed workout and blood and urine sampling. Both samples must have no detectable clenbuterol. The testing costs will be paid by the owner(s) of the horse.
  - e. The horse may not enter to race until all requirements have been completed in subdivision (d).
2. If clenbuterol is detected in a horse's post-race or out of competition sample and appropriate notification as outlined in subdivision 1 (a) or (b) was not completed, the horse shall immediately be placed on the official Veterinarian's List pending the outcome of an investigation. (c) The horse shall be required to meet all conditions for removal from the veterinarian's list outlined in subdivision 1 (d), above. The confirmation of clenbuterol in a test sample of a horse without a valid prescription or in a post-race sample constitutes a violation of Gulfstream Park House Rules. In addition, possession of clenbuterol without a valid veterinarian's prescription is a violation of Gulfstream Park House Rules.

### **TCO 2 TESTING**

The practice of milk shaking horses entered to race at Gulfstream Park is **PROHIBITED**. Testing for total carbon dioxide (TCO 2) blood serum levels will be conducted. **All horses competing in Graded**

**Stakes will be tested.** Additionally, any horse entered to race may be randomly selected for testing. Refusing or failing to permit the taking of a pre-race blood sample will result in a scratch from the race and shall be considered as a violation of this house rule, resulting in disciplinary action by the Stewards.

#### **HYPERBARIC OXYGEN THERAPY**

A horse shall not receive hyperbaric oxygen therapy within seventy-two (72) hours of race post time. Horses receiving this therapy may do so only within valid veterinarian/client/patient relationship. The attending veterinarian must be on the premises during treatment and must provide a log of all horses receiving treatment. Additionally, the operator must provide a certificate of liability insurance. These restrictions shall apply to all other forms of purified oxygen treatment.

#### **EXTRA CORPOREAL SHOCK WAVE THERAPY**

Extra Corporeal Shock Wave Therapy (ECSW) equipment (focused shock wave and radial pressure wave) may be employed only by veterinarians licensed and in good standing with the Florida Board of Veterinary Medicine and the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. Before administering Shock Wave therapy to a horse, the treating veterinarian will be required to contact Security in the Stable Office of the corresponding facility. Security will ensure that a signed Shock Wave Treatment Policy is on file prior to authorizing treatment. Security will accompany the treating veterinarian to the barn and remain present during the treatment of a horse. A Shock Wave Treatment Report must be submitted to Security before the treatment is completed. Shock Wave Treatments may be administered seven days between the hours of 10:00am and 5:00pm. Shock Wave Treatment Reports will be maintained by Security and will be made available upon request.

Security will make every reasonable effort to have an officer available to accompany the attending veterinarian and verify the treatment. Veterinarians planning to treat several horses during one session are encouraged to make an appointment with Security.

Shock Wave Therapy machines used for treatment of horses racing at Gulfstream Park, Gulfstream Park West or stabled at the Palm Meadows Training Center must be registered with the Senior Association Veterinarian, Carlos Aponte, DVM.

Horses may not race or work for a minimum of ten (10) days after receiving a Shock Wave Therapy treatment. Day "one" will be considered the first day following the date of the treatment. (Example: if you receive a Shock Wave Therapy treatment on January 1, you will be eligible to run on January 12).

Violations of the Shock Wave Treatment Policies shall be subject to Gulfstream Management review. Penalties may include monetary fines, the revocation of Gulfstream Park credentials and/or the denial of the privilege of working on the grounds of all Stronach Group Properties.

### **FLORIDA VETERINARIAN'S LIST**

1. Horses placed on the Florida Veterinarian's List must wait a minimum of seven days before being eligible to work for the regulatory veterinarian. If the regulatory veterinarian feels that a seven-day waiting period is insufficient for the injury in question, the trainer will be required to provide evidence proving otherwise. This could include, and not be limited to, performance of diagnostic procedures and disclosure of results;
2. Horses must work, with the regulatory veterinarian present, no less than ½ mile in 52 seconds or less. Horses maybe required to work 5F depending on their history or veterinarian's list jurisdiction.
3. Horses must jog soundly prior to their work, immediately after their work, and back at the barn once cooled out. Horses that are unsound at any time will remain on the veterinarian's list.
4. All horses must be sampled for the presence of medications. Samples containing medications in excess of permitted race day levels will remain on the veterinarian's list. Split samples will not be available for testing.
5. Trainers with medication violations will be subject to penalties imposed by management and not limited to fines, removal of the horse from the grounds of the association, and/or suspension.
6. Management exercises discretion with respect to the degree of the medication violation and the corresponding penalty;
7. Veterinarian List medication penalties must be satisfied prior to accepting future entries from the trainer.
8. If the horse breezes in acceptable fashion and jogs soundly for the regulatory veterinarian, **YOU MAY ENTER THE HORSE** while waiting for the blood work results, however, if the blood work results come back positive or do not arrive before the first post on race day, the horse will be scratched.
9. The owner and trainer of any horse placed on the veterinarian's list will be notified, and the owner will be liable for the cost of the post work blood test.

### **EQUINE DRUG TESTING**

All winning horses will be subjected to TOBA Super testing for the presence of performance enhancing drugs. Gulfstream Park may participate in a program to freeze and store blood and urine samples so that retrospective testing may be done if necessary.

### **SPLIT SAMPLE AND STEWARD HEARING PROCEDURES**

Once you have received written notification of a medication violation by either the Stewards or the Division's Bureau of Investigations, you have ten (10) calendar days to request a split sample of the Division's Steward. You will then be required to select a laboratory from a list of laboratories approved by the Division to perform your split sample

analysis. You must make arrangements for payment of all charges incurred with the testing. These charges will range from \$300 - \$400 for phenylbutazone (Bute) and approximately \$600 - \$1300 for most other medication testing. If the Florida laboratory's findings are not confirmed by the laboratory performing the split sample analysis, no further disciplinary action will be taken by either the Stewards or the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.

Failure to request a split sample or make payment for same will be considered a waiver of your rights to a split sample. Once a split sample has been requested, an immediate stay is granted until the split sample results are received, and the Stewards' Hearing is held. You may have legal or other qualified representation at your hearing.

In the absence of a split sample request, a Stewards' hearing can be conducted after five (5) days' notice, unless both parties agree to an alternative date. Post hearing you have the right to file an appeal within ten (10) days of the Stewards decision. All civil penalties imposed by the Stewards must be paid within fifteen (15) days of the ruling. Payment of penalties may be postponed at the discretion of the Stewards for good cause.

## **GUEST SERVICES**

Guest Services is located within the Breezeway, between Silks and the Finish Line Casino, and opens at 11:00am on all live race days. Gulfstream Park and all race related information may be obtained here as well as wagering assistance. Guest Relations stands are manned by trained staff and located throughout the park. Overnights, betting guides, track location maps and other racing related informational flyers and pamphlets can be obtained at the Guest Relations areas, generally at no charge. Guest Relations personnel will be on hand throughout the racing day to answer any questions patrons may have.

## **GULFSTREAM PARK ASSOCIATION RULES**

The Association shall promulgate House Rules which shall be applicable to the Association's current race meet. Copies of the House Rules shall be available for review in the office of the Stewards. All participants racing at the Association's facility shall comply with the House Rules promulgated by the Association and the rules promulgated by the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.

**This Association will not be responsible for any injury to any horses at any time, for any reason on any part of the premises.** Consent is also given to the Track Vet to release injury date when required or deemed appropriate. It is the responsibility of the trainer and the attending licensed veterinarian to inform the stable area security office that a horse is deceased and to provide the required details and information.

Anyone utilizing Gulfstream Park premises is a Licensee of Gulfstream and subject to the following conditions:

Exclusive Vested Rights in GULFSTREAM PARK: That (a) GULFSTREAM PARK reserves for itself the exclusive right and sole discretion to enter, modify, alter or change the physical condition or use of any of its facilities, wherever located on its Premises; (b)

permission granted herein to the Licensee to use the Premises does not constitute a lease of such facilities and GULFSTREAM PARK maintains the sole interest in and exclusive control of the Premises and said facilities; and (c) GULFSTREAM PARK reserves to itself the exclusive right and sole discretion to reduce the number of stalls assigned and/or change the location

of stalls assigned to the Licensee or to cause the removal of any horse from the Premises.

Applicable Rules and Regulations: The license granted hereunder is subject to and shall be governed by the conditions, rules and regulations of GULFSTREAM PARK as contained herein and as set forth in its House Rules, Condition Books, Stakes Guide, Nomination Blanks and other materials published or disseminated by GULFSTREAM PARK or posted in its Racing Secretary's Office, entry booths, or in any other GULFSTREAM PARK publications (collectively hereafter the "Rules and Regulations") all of which are incorporated herein by reference. Rules and Regulations are subject to change from time to time and any changes shall be deemed effective when made with or without notice to the Licensee.

**ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE, AND WAIVER**

(a). Release and Waiver. GULFSTREAM PARK shall not under any circumstances be liable or responsible for any losses, injuries or damages to person or property sustained by the trainers or by the owners or by any of the horses trained by the trainers or owned by the owners while entered in any racing event or while participating in such events, or while training or while otherwise on the Premises for any reason or while being transported in vehicles owned or leased or controlled by GULFSTREAM PARK or its agents from any point whatsoever.

(b). Assumption of Risk. In consideration of the stall space licensed hereunder for which there is no monetary charge, Trainers and Owners understand and agree that all risks of loss, loss of use, injury, damage or death to person or property (including horses) by fire, theft, accident, disease or otherwise are assumed in full by the trainers and the owners, whether caused by the active or the passive negligence of GULFSTREAM PARK, by the condition of the Premises, by the design of the Premises or any part thereof or by any other reason or causes whatsoever. The provisions of this paragraph shall not be deemed waived by GULFSTREAM PARK by the fact that GULFSTREAM PARK does presently or may or may not in the future carry liability insurance coverage against claims or losses resulting from injury or damage to person or property (including horses) while competing or training on the racetrack or while otherwise on the Premises.

(c). Indemnification. By stabling and/or racing at Gulfstream Park or any of the Stronach Group owned or managed properties, the trainers and owners irrevocably agree to indemnify, hold harmless and defend GULFSTREAM PARK from any claims, losses, liabilities or demands whatsoever resulting from or arising directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, from any act or omission of the trainer, owner and/or their agents and employees, in connection with the trainer's and/or owner's activities on the Premises, including injuries to or damages caused by any horse trained by the trainer. This indemnification shall include, but not be limited to, attorney's fees and costs incurred in enforcing the provisions of this paragraph. This indemnification shall not be effective against the trainer or owner when the claim, loss or damage is caused solely by the gross negligence of GULFSTREAM PARK. Otherwise, the provisions of this Indemnification paragraph are intended to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by Florida Law.

#### **EQUINE INJURY DATABASE**

In consideration of the acceptance of a nomination of any horse(s) to any race described in this condition book, the owner(s) and trainer of such horse(s) consent to the collection of information related to any injury to such horse(s) occurring at Gulfstream Park or its associated training facilities and entry of said information into a database maintained by The Jockey Club (the "Equine Injury Database"). Said owner(s) and trainer further covenant not to sue and agree, to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, to indemnify, release, hold harmless Gulfstream Park any state- or track-appointed veterinarian collecting such information and The Jockey Club (the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any liability, cost, loss or expense of any kind or nature (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fee) arising from any claim, demand, or action (a) alleging that the data entered into the Equine Injury Database (either directly or indirectly) violates the rights of the owner(s), trainer or any third party, or (b) relating to any equine injury report run, published or otherwise created by any of the Indemnified Parties, including the owners, stewards, directors, officers, employees and agents of any of them (either directly or indirectly).

All licensed personnel entering and remaining in the stable area shall at all time wear in plain view the photo badge issued to them. Any violation of this rule will result in disciplinary action.

No person shall use improper, profane or indecent language.
