Race 6: April goes out a roaring lion Thursday with an 11-race program at Gulfstream. Seriously, there's a lot to like about the card, from the \$850,000 jackpot Rainbow 6 guarantee, the cast of two-year-old fillies in the 2nd and the quality turf action in races 6 and 9 for example. I'm with Fuddled (no, it's not a hunch play, thank you) in the 6th race as this Irish-bred filly makes her second career start for e Five Racing and Saffie Joseph Jr. She'll face some familiar competition, given the fact that the "two-through-four" finishers exit the same Mar. 27 turf sprint. Fuddled pulled a great trip in that race, finished a solid and clear-cut second (to favored First Wave) and earned a solid speed figure. I think she's tough. Meanwhile, Gloriously looks to improve in her fourth lifetime start for Stronach Stables and Jimmy Jerkens. She was soundly beaten by Fuddled here last month but may simply step forward in her second career turf race and second start off an approximate 7.5 month layoff. Gloriously owns a fleet and fast cruising speed and is likely to be in that first flight with Senora Roma and Coin the Phrase. This could be a blazingly run, fast-paced turf sprint. If that happens, Fuddled becomes even more of a win threat as far as I am concerned.

Race 4: It's not often Hall of Famer Shug McGaughey saddles a \$16k maiden claimer but he's got one in the 4th race named Cloudbased. Cloudbased exits an average looking Tampa Bay maiden claimer two weeks ago – it was the gelding's first race in about nine months – but he's supposed to run better here with the dip to \$16k and the fact there wasn't a lot of movement behind Danceronthebeach, who wired that field as the 9/5 favorite. Cloudbased is the first horse to return from that Apr. 11 "maiden-30" up north.

Race 2: For me, it was a case of "remember when" as I looked over the pedigrees among race 2's cast of juvenile fillies. The biggest reaction occurred in seeing Social Inclusion's name as the sire of the first-time starting Special Inclusion. Special Inclusion goes from the rail for Gilberto Zerpa and Emisael Jaramillo and if she's anything like her pops, will be tough to catch. This is the first starter at stud for Social Inclusion, who amazingly never won a stakes race despite him being one of the most gifted three-year-olds of the 2014 class. A little pragmatism when it comes to campaigning a top horse never hurt anyone.
